

Welcome to this June/July (Winter) edition of the *MUC MAG*. As always, it is full of interesting items to read and photos to view. The street party on 28th March was a great success, perhaps due to the beautiful sunny day, and Bruce has provided a page of photos of that event.

Not surprisingly, the onset of the colder weather has increased the possibility of contracting illnesses like colds, 'flu, and of course the corona virus. Already, a sudden increase in reported cases of corona virus around Victoria has led to lockdown restrictions being applied. This in turn has impacted the manner in which our worship services and other activities can be conducted. Two "positives" concerning this are:

1. We experienced harsher measures last year, and therefore have established ways of making worship and communications possible; and
2. The congregation endorsed the proposal to upgrade/install audio and video facilities to reduce the workload on Bruce and me in providing online streaming, YouTube videos and USB versions of our worship services.

These mean that, whatever might befall us, we can continue to share in learning and applying the Will of God to our daily lives.

That said, we are very fortunate to have the Moderator of the Victorian/Tasmanian Synod as our guest preacher for the 44th Anniversary of the Uniting Church worship service on 20th June. It is hoped that there will be no restrictions on gatherings for worship services at that time so that our doors can be wide open as the congregations of Coatesville and Leighmoor have been invited to join us at Murrumbeena.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Warren Cramer for being willing to be Chairperson of the Congregation. I'm sure the change from me will be most welcome. I also thank Roz Franklin for stepping into the role of Secretary of the Congregation, taking over from Peter Barnes, and also Marg Edwards for being willing to continue in her role of Representative of the Congregation to the Presbytery of Port Phillip East.



FROM THE MINISTER...

As I write this I am preparing for some leave. The last 12 months have been a challenge for us all in one way or another, but things are moving ok at the moment and we have the ability to gather, to worship together and to begin to plan for the rest of 2021 and into the future.

April and May have seen the coming and going of the season of Easter and we have now entered into the season of Pentecost. Pentecost, although we celebrate this on one day, is the longest season of the church. We are in the season of Pentecost now until we begin Advent at the end of November. We have a couple of festival days in this season, but most of the time our colour for the season is Green. In this time of Pentecost, we tend to focus a bit more on some themed series and this will happen again over June, July and August.

Speaking of festival days, you will see the flyer giving some more information about the service to be held on 20th June 2021. The anniversary of the Uniting Church of Australia is on 21st June where in 1977 the three churches of Methodists, Presbyterians and Congregationalists came together. This year we are celebrating as the three churches in our cluster, Leighmoor UC, Coatesville UC and ourselves, come together to celebrate. We have the honour of the Moderator of the Vic/Tas Synod Rev Denise Liersch preaching for us. Murrumbeena UC will host the service and the planning has begun not only around the service but also for the morning tea to follow. This will be a great time of worship and fellowship so don't miss out.

Our bunch groups are slowly getting together and sorted out. There have been some good conversations about what we are doing here at MUC and what we could be doing. More opportunity for these conversations will take place over the next couple of months so keep your eyes and ears open for details.

We've been approached by the people at Compass Community Care to be part of the Winter Shelter Program for Glen Eira. Generally, this is a great program to be involved in and church council is working through just what that might involve. In the meantime there is the opportunity for us all individually to get involved and sign up as a volunteer. All the details and links about this are in another space in the MUC Mag, so please consider getting involved.

I want to take a moment to thank our outgoing Congregational Chair and Secretary. Roger McCowan as chair and Peter Barnes as secretary have given a valuable service to the congregation in their leadership. I believe Roger has been Congregational Chair for well over 10 years (I think he told me 15!) and I'm afraid I don't know how long Peter has been secretary, at least the 5 years that I have been here. It is always so important for our members to step up into leadership positions.

We welcome Warren Cramer as the new Congregational Chair and Roz Franklin as Secretary. Thank you both for your willingness to accept the nominations for these roles. We also thank Marg Edwards for continuing to be our Presbytery Representative.

Hello Murrumbeena Uniting folks,

Hope you are all well and enjoying this beautiful autumnal weather. These articles always feel like they roll round so quickly, so much happens in a two-month period. Things in Children and Families Ministries are going well. One of the highlights of the past couple of months was our Church Street Party that we celebrated on Neighbour Day. It was so well attended and engaged with; I would say we had over 150 people involved throughout the day. From a children and young people perspective we would have had over 25 young people involved, playing with the giant games (thanks to the Salvation Army for loaning these to us), enjoying Kelly's incredible face painting skills, dancing joyfully to the live music of Marilla Homes and friends, or devouring fairy floss (or to keep John happy "cotton candy") and popcorn. All involved had a really wonderful and fun day. One of my favourite moments was having a belly bumper fight with Leila; we had so much fun as I know other adults who let their hair down and released their inner child did also. As a result of what we did at the Street Party and through some connections with Kelly we have been contacted by a group of people who run a monthly community even at the lawn bowls club known as Local Sundays, from what we understand attracts a large following of families from Murrumbeena. This is an exciting missional opportunity that we hope to become further involved with, more details to follow.

The Easter Sunday service was a success, I received really positive and encouraging feedback from children, their families and other congregant members. I started planning the kids message in August last year and I had a lot of fun preparing the talk and making the Easter eggs by hand (thanks to Bek who is my girlfriend for helping to make the handmade eggs a plausible reality). I loved watching the kids smash them open, pull out the item and exploring the Passion Story together. After the egg-smash, we all went out and had an egg hunt it was great fun, the kids delighted in running around, looking under and over things and just generally having a good time (see photos). After the hunt we told the Easter Story in more detail and received some really wonderful questions from young curious minds that as always challenged and broadened my ideas and understanding of faith. Children and young people have an uncanny way of looking at things, that help us adults engage with something in a new or fresh way. It was so lovely to have 13 kids and their respective families involved with Easter Sunday and the hunt. It was especially lovely to have another Christian Community the GMIM Immanuel Indonesian congregation join us and come out with our kids.

Connections at the primary school are going really well, we have just started back in the kitchen garden program and it is wonderful to see the kids engaging with the curriculum, building their knowledge of local and seasonal produce and developing key social and culinary skills through our time in the kitchen. I enjoy sharing what I do here at Murrumbeena with the students and parent volunteers.



It is a really great space to be involved with to strengthen our community ties and I (therefore the Church) are becoming more well known.

Sundays are going well, the kids are engaging with the new style of storytelling where they build the story in the kids room while I read it. As always they are asking good questions, enjoying the games, and praying together. Thanks as always to Carol, Glenda, Marg and Rachel your volunteer leadership with this Ministry is vital, without you we could not meet. Each of you bring your own unique and refreshing perspective to the role, thank you.

Over the holidays we ran a day long program for the families of the Church, we had 6 sign up but only 3 were able to attend which is still a great number. We had a fun time playing group games such as giants treasure, musical statues and musical chairs, with some crafting, geography quizzes, puzzles, card games, lunch and an afternoon Disney movie, Christopher Robin. The kids had a lot of fun as I believe did Glenda and Marg who were kindly involved with leading. One of the kids asked when the next holiday program will be, so that was really encouraging.



As usual, I wanted to leave some space to hear from other voices in the Church, Laura Jobson has kindly agreed to write a reflection from the perspective of a family who is directly involved within the Ministry of Children and Families.

Zak is doing an outstanding job with the children and families ministry. Our children (actually Dan and me too) love his Sunday talks - they so cleverly and clearly outline the Bible passage for the children. Our children particularly loved the Easter Sunday service, where the story of the resurrection was told using objects within Easter eggs and the kids were able to crack open the eggs. Zak also ran a great school holiday program that our kids really enjoyed attending. They came home chatting about all the great things they had done...and all the watermelon they had been given! My parents were down visiting from Sydney the other week and visited the Church. After the service they both commented on how great Zak is. We feel very blessed to have Zak running the Ministry of Children and Families. Thanks Zak!


Thanks to Laura for those kind and encouraging words, so great to hear from you. It is always wonderful to hear from those within our community who engage with us on a regular basis.

WHAT IS THE SONDER COLLECTIVE UP TO?

Well, what a lot of things that are happening in the life of Murrumbeena with the Sonder Collective. This community is more diverse than the individuals that sit in the pews at Murrumbeena, as we have been able to share, and join in, more widely with our youth and young adults community — this includes the diversity of leadership, peers and theologies.

We have seen the incredible effect this missional community has had across our churches as many people gift their time and resources across communities and denominations to make sure that The Sonder Collective thrives. In fact, it has been noted quite significantly in two ways over the last month.

One way is via the UC Children's and Families Network that shares resources across the life of Victoria and Tasmania. Earlier in this quarter I was asked to share in the connection between digital ministry and faith formation. This video has been on Facebook is May 19 and has been watched nearly 500 times - it shares how The Sonder Collective is engaging with faith through the games and community.

It is only three minutes long, but it helps address the question of engaging faith online with no limits to connection, question or communication.

The other notable area is having the opportunity to be interviewed for a research paper, where an individual was wanting to explore the online community of The Sonder Collective as one of their Case Studies for their Thesis. I cannot wait for this to be published in an academic journal.

Moments like these above remind me that The Sonder Collective is not only an effective form of mission, but that people are seeing it as an innovative way to do ministry in the twenty-first century. The model is challenging people, and helps us to ask the question of what we think church actually is; particularly when communities, like The Sonder Collective, are being seen as effective ways of sharing the Jesus story.

IS THERE ANYTHING ELSE THAT IS NEW?

Yes! In fact, there have been a number of Murrumbeena people who have engaged already, but in case you missed it there has been one awesome thing we have started called 'OddSonder'. What is it? Well, on Monday Nights at 7:00pm myself and Rev Will Nicholas, from St David's Uniting in Newtown, livestream a podcast that we have started to produce. What this means is that people can listen to the podcast whenever they would like, but also that people can come and be a part of the audience, ask us questions, send us messages and interact with us as we record. Not only are these moments full of humour and some games together, but Will and I share the upcoming lectionary reading for that week. We spend time unpacking the message behind what these readings might mean, and we get to help our listeners understand things that churchgoers take for-granted — such as understanding our 'churched-language' with words like 'liturgy' or 'lectionary'.

After we finish sharing the livestream on Facebook and Twitch, we upload it to a podcast program for others to listen in their own time. But this does not mean all is over on a Monday night, as we continue the conversation with those who still have further questions about the topics that were raised. We call this the "After Party" and we have had an amazing time sharing and unpacking faith and theology together.

Everyone is welcome into these conversations, and we have had more than just the youth and young adult at Murrumbeena get involved — feel free to ask how to connect in and come and explore your faith in more ways than you may have experienced; you might learn something about your relationship with God that you had never thought about before.

GLEN EIRA WINTER SHELTER

MUC is investigating its ability to provide our premises for one night a week for this program. The Glen Eira Winter Shelter will be running from 1st July - 23rd September (12 weeks).

The process is that each church will take turns one night a week sheltering up to 10 homeless guests and providing dinner, breakfast and the option to make sandwiches for lunch.

The following churches have also agreed to be host churches:

- » Ormond Anglican
- » St Agnes Anglican
- » St Clements Anglican
- » Holy Cross Catholic
- » Seventh Day Adventist Glen Huntly
- » Eastleigh Community Church



Compass church will provide its facilities (including a shower) during the day. To do this we need 200 volunteers from all of our local churches and the community.

All volunteers will be asked to undergo police checks and working with children checks and training will be provided.

The photo shows the friendly fellows enjoying a recent breakfast at the Brew Bar in Hughesdale. During the Winter months, the breakfasts will be at Cafe Del Mar, with the prospect of returning to the Brew Bar in the Spring.

As previously advised, our dinners on the fourth Tuesday of each month will alternate between the church and the Chai Thai restaurant, always at 5:30pm. In each even-numbered month, the gathering will be in church foyer, where the meal will comprise bulk order takeaway food distributed by one person with gloves and tongs. BYO food is also possible. There will be some furniture cleaning needed afterwards, and minimal washing up. Dates: 22 June, 24 August, 26 October, and 14 December (two weeks earlier, for Christmas).

For each other month, (dates: 27 July, 28 September, and 23 November), the dinner will be at Chai Thai, Murrumbeena.

Factors behind the changes include COVID concerns, the ability to have talks with some confidentiality at both venues, and the close availability of the church car park and toilet/washing facilities and takeaway venues.
